It is hard to believe we are [once again] on the doorstep of that wonderful time of the year, 'Christmas'. The English word "Advent" comes from the Latin *adventus*, which means "coming." The season of Advent is a time of waiting and anticipation as we prepare to welcome the coming of Christ into our lives.

This year our **Advent Mass** is on Thursday, December 14th at 9:30 am at St. Mark Church. In addition, we will be celebrating two Advent Liturgies at the school; our first **Advent Liturgy** (*Hope*) is on Monday, December 4th at 9:30 am, and our final **Advent Liturgy** is on Tuesday, December 19th at 9:30 am. The Advent Liturgies at the school will be celebrated in the gym. Students and staff are encouraged to wear **purple** on the Monday of the first Advent Liturgy, **green** & **red** on the Thursday of our Advent Mass at St. Mark Church, and **pink** on the Tuesday of our final Advent Liturgy at the school. Parents/guardians are welcomed and encouraged to attend our Mass at the Church on Thursday, December 14th at 9:30 am; the children will be singing songs at the end of the Mass.

Christmas Craft Activity Day is on Wednesday, December 20th. Students from all classes K-8 will have an opportunity to engage and participate in a fun Christmas craft led by their teachers. More information about the Christmas Craft Activity Day is forthcoming and will come from your child's classroom teacher.

In lieu of a Christmas Concert this year, Student Council will be sharing a variety of activities over the morning announcements each day to help put everyone in the Christmas spirit. CHRISTMAS THEME DAY REMINDER

Christmas Theme Day is on Friday, December 22nd and this day is also one of our Nutritional Free Days. Your child/children can bring treats to school from home on this day for their consumption and/or sharing. Since we have students at the school, who have peanut and nut allergies, we ask you to be extra careful in checking labels and avoid sending any holiday treats to school that may contain peanut or nut products. This is a life- threatening situation for these children. Also, as a reminder, please do not send your child to school with treats for distribution. As mentioned, you are welcomed to send in treats for your own child on this fun-filled day of Christmas colours and activities. Thank you once again by showing your care and concern for all children by helping to provide a safe learning environment.

PARKING REMINDER FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Thank you to all parents, guardians and caregivers who have been following the rules for dropping your children at school and picking them up at the end of classes. The safety of your children remains the priority for everyone at St. Mark School.

A continued reminder to those who are not following our guidelines:

PARENTS/GUARDIANS ARE NOT TO BE USING THE SCHOOL PARKING LOTS TO PICK UP THEIR CHILD/CHILDREN BETWEEN 8:40 AM AND 3:40 PM; Parents/Guardians who have a child enrolled in the Extended Day Program can use the parking lot from 7:00 am – 8:40 am and 3:40 pm – 6:00 pm.

Parents/Guardians are not to be parking in the handicapped space unless they have a permit or the principal's permission to do so. Parents/Guardians are not to be parking in the school zone on Autumn Hill Crescent; we encourage parents to park on the school side of Autumn Hill Crescent when dropping their child/children off to school again, not in the school zone; a city Bi-Law Officer will issue tickets to those who do not comply.

PARENT/GUARDIANS ARE ALSO ASKED TO BE RESPECTFUL WHEN PARKING ON AUTUMN HILL CRESCENT; WE ASK THAT YOU DO NOT PARK IN FRONT OF A CITIZEN'S DRIVEWAY, DO NOT PARK, OR DROP OFF YOUR CHILD IN A CITIZEN'S DRIVEWAY, OR USE A DRIVEWAY TO MAKE A 3-POINT TURN – THESE ACTIONS ARE UNSAFE FOR OUR STUDENTS AND OUR LOCAL NEIGHBOURS.

When students are dropped-off they are not to be walking through the parking lot on their own – students need to use the sidewalks. Parents are to stay on the city sidewalks when dropping off/picking up their children.

Together, let's continue to make our school the safest place for our students.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL

We certainly understand that a child needs to stay home if they are ill or as directed by Public Health. We never want a child to attend school if they are feeling sick; they should be home resting and receive care. Any absenteeism has an impact upon the pupil. Chronic absenteeism can be an indicator of academic failure or of other social/emotional factors and can have a direct negative effect on all areas of a child's development and subsequent adjustment in future years. Once a pupil is enrolled in school, regular school attendance is mandatory. The enforcement of school attendance is required for all pupils of compulsory school age up to the age of 18. Non-attendance should be considered serious and detrimental when:

- 1. The absence is unexplained.
- 2. A pattern is evident (e.g., late arrivals, skipped classes, and/or absences per week).
- $3. \ There \ is \ a \ history \ of \ previous \ attendance \ concerns \ with \ the \ pupil \ or \ siblings.$
- 4. The absences negatively impact upon academic success.
- 5. The pupil reaches 10 cumulative days per term or 20 cumulative days within a school year.
- 6. The pupil reaches 5 15 consecutive days of absence.

Discretion is certainly utilized in examining the reasons for non-attendance. For example, the following may be contributing factors: legitimate illness and serious illness or death of a family member. We appreciate when parents or guardians leave the reason for absence on the phone messaging machine; this helps us to understand the nature of the absence.

Please refer to the PDF documents below for more information about the impact absenteeism from school. Let's all work together to ensure that our children are attending school regularly.

WCDSB Athletics Code of Conduct

- Remember that participants play for their own enjoyment.
- Hold realistic expectations. Remember that players are not professionals and cannot be judged by professional standards.
- Respect the decisions of the officials and encourage participants to do the same.
- Understand that mistakes are okay, and that they are an important part of learning.

- Show respect for your team's opponents, be-cause without them, there would be no game.
- Only use positive language with players, coaches, officials, and other spectators.
- Respect the coaches' decisions and encourage open communication with them.



Walking or cycling to school is a smart choice

Walking to school can lead to better academic performance. Just 20 minutes of walking in the morning can increase mental focus at school for up to four hours! This can lead to higher test scores, better music practice, or even a better soccer game! Just look at the difference between brain activity in a student who sat quietly in the morning and one who was active for 20 minutes:



St. Mark is working with the city and the school board through School Travel Planning to help make walking and cycling and easier choice for your family. Let us know if you would like to help!

Skills that last outside of the classroom

Children who bike and walk to school learn skills that can be applied to situations beyond their daily school travel. These skills include safe riding, navigating pedestrian crosswalks and awareness of traffic and others on the road.

By participating in conversations with your child around safe walking and riding, your children will gain confidence in navigating neighbourhood streets during their time outside of school. In addition, children will be able to practice these skills in a supportive environment. Setting children up with safe riding and walking habits will ensure they are confident every time they walk and bike in their communities. Start with STSWR's Sidewalk Smarts Passport that outlines various pedestrian skills needed by students in

Waterloo region. You can track your child's progress by noting whether they can explain the skill, is capable of the skill, or always practices the skill. When they always practice the skill, you can feel more confident that they will do these things even when you are not with them.

MILKOVAC: INCREASING KNOWLEDGE ABOUT VACCINATIONS

The MILKOVAC service is based on a successful Quebec public health program called, 'Maternity Motivational Interviewing for Child Immunization', aka the EMMIE program. The EMMIE program is an educational intervention in maternity wards using the motivational interviewing approach, which has already demonstrated its ability to increase parents' knowledge of vaccination and reinforce their motivation to vaccinate their children. MILKOVAC offers parents the opportunity to consult a vaccination counsellor free of charge to answer any questions they may have.

MILKOVAC counsellors understand the concerns and questions parents may have regarding vaccinations for their elementary school-aged children. Using a humanistic, non-judgmental approach, MILKOVAC is designed to provide parents with accurate information, guidance, and support to help them make informed decisions in accordance with recommended vaccination schedules.

MILKOVAC offers free online one-on-one consultations tailored to parents' specific needs. Interested parents can access the MILKOVAC website, as indicated in the pamphlet accompanying this correspondence and proceed to schedule an appointment with an immunization counsellor by following the outlined instructions (*see flyer for details*).
